If Auckland now moves away from placing safety limits on election signs what will it do next and what will it do when someone is injured or killed here? Who will be responsible? What guidance will be given to politicians about what is safe for their signs? Has this idea of giving up on these safe font size limits been put to your Ophthalmists and Dispensing Opticians Board or any other professional or medical research or advice body to confirm that the proposal is safe? I agree with the proposal to remove the specified font sizes on hoardings, namely the the revocation of clause 7(1)(r) of the Auckland Transport Election Signs Bylaw (2013). My reasons are as follows: - The insertion of this provision occurred late in the setting of the bylaw, and not in the original draft bylaw. This was a radical change and did not receive sufficient and robust enough public consultation and discussion. Candidates who had already designed their hoardings based on the long established system were put at a disadvantage by these poorly signaled changes. - Road safety is important, and I agree with measures that can demonstrably improve road safety. However there has not been a strong case that these provisions enhance road safety, or that hoardings with smaller fonts have created a sufficient enough safety issue to warrant a change along these lines. - These provisions do not allow for hoardings to meet the needs of candidates, and so undermines the robustness of the election process. Groups of candidates would have been unable to display their names, the name of the area and position they were standing for and a photograph, which are all essential elements in a hoarding. This process would have privileged individual candidates over teams of candidates

I was trying to work out why Auckland Transport was involved in this bylaw at all and so I went read the law. I accept now that Auckland Transport can make these bylaws but I think that you are quite wrong to try to claim that you can do it without using the proper bylaw process. Section 46 of the Auckland Council Act states that Auckland Transport has the powers of a local authority under the Transport Act. If it has the powers of a local authority then under the consultation section of the Land Transport Act (section 22AD) Then it must use the special consultation procedure to make its bylaw. Having just three days consultation and no hearings does not meet the requirements of the special consultation procedure and so this amendment of the bylaw is not legal. Any candidate who has signs that don't comply with the real bylaw and who gets elected will face the risk of having their election challenged by a candidate who lost but did comply with the real rules. This just adds more confusion and no one will know what size fonts it is legally safe to use.

Reasons - Clause 2

I do accept that the change in letter size is appropriate. The existing 7 (1) R should remain for safety reasons.

While it is true proposed changes do not impose any additional requirements they do remove a major safety control which ensures drivers are not distracted when driving and viewing the signs.

Both drivers and pedestrian safety could be compromised.

Most of the election sign sites are around very busy intersections and roads and safety must be the major consideration.

The minimal size letters helps promote the safety of such signs and should remain.

Auckland Transport should not remove the only traffic safety control the bylaw currently has.

Candidates should appreciate the major concessions that the signs bylaw already gives such a small group of the public. Such benefits are not given to any group who need signage.

That Section requires you to comply with Section 83 of the Local Government Act 2002 (LGA)

Section 83 of the LGA requires a period of 1 month to be given for submissions.

You have only provided 3 days, that is incorrect.

Please advise under which Act such short notice can be given.

In your Clause 5 and 6 you try to justify your short notice due to impending election and the recent consultation process. I made a submission on the new bylaw and you failed to include it in the process. I am concerned that other submissions were likewise omitted. Therefore I do not consider you "concluded the consultation process" correctly.

I can accept the billboard illumination proposal as acceptable as they are on commercial billboards set up for advertising purposes.
