Transport Minister Simon Bridges, Mayor Len Brown and Mangere-Otahuhu Local Board Deputy Chair Carrol Elliott marked the start of construction on the \$28 million Otahuhu Station at the Salesyard Road site with the turning of the first sod.

The project is funded by Auckland Council and the Government through the New Zealand Transport Agency. The fully-integrated bus and train station is expected to open in the second half of 2016 and will enable the roll-out of the new public transport network.

Work on constructing the station building and concourse started on 14 November. Downer New Zealand is carrying out the main construction works.

## Upcoming changes

### Train services

Work near and on the rail corridor will periodically require blocking one or both train lines and electrically isolating the overhead lines. The next expected rail shutdown is from **27 December 2015** to **4 January 2016**. Please be aware of changes to train schedules with buses replacing train services.
