The construction of the Devonport Town Centre Safety Improvement project started on 12 June 2023 after our consultation and significant community input. We acknowledge everyone who shared their views with AT including representatives from the community, Business Association, Bike Auckland, Devonport-Takapuna Local Board and Ward Councillors.

What we are doing

We will be building raised crossings, a separated cycleway, upgrading streetlighting at pedestrian crossings, minor footpath upgrades, and making other safety improvements around the area.

These improvements will slow down traffic to create an environment that is safer for everyone. Check out our staging map below that shows how we will be constructing our safety improvements.

Epa has been the main driving force behind the construction operations, working alongside the ground staff as well as office staff to hit target milestones.


Epa's highlight on this project so far is delivering two speed tables and pouring a third within the space of two weeks during the recent school holidays.

In August, we will complete Phase D, F and G of the project


Phase D consists of a raised pedestrian crossing on Flagstaff Terrace
