Project Update: We're extending the Station Road full road closure

Kia ora,

We are writing to let you know that we're extending the road closure of Station Road between State Highway 16 and Schoolside Road until the end of July.

Why we need to keep the road closed for longer

Our biggest reasons for keeping the road closed for longer are:

1. **Enhanced safety:** Keeping the road closed for a few weeks longer as we complete this critical stage of works helps ensure the highest level of safety for both our construction team and the public. It will eliminate the risk of vehicles entering the work zone, preventing accidents and injuries.
2. **Construction delays due to recent severe weather:** Recent severe weather events have unfortunately delayed our progress. We appreciate your understanding as we work diligently to overcome these challenges and complete the project as swiftly as possible.

Where	Station Road between SH16 and Schoolside Road
Hours	24/7 road closure. Working hours will be from 7am to 7pm.
Duration	End of July 2024

The work we're doing

We're implementing a full road closure due to the extensive nature of the works. Because the existing road width is so narrow and confined, a full closure will allow our construction crews the necessary room to carry out their work excavating the existing road and building the new, wider road, safely, as well as sufficient space to move our large vehicles and equipment. A full road closure will also allow crews to complete a wider range of tasks more efficiently, resulting in reduced construction time.

The full scope of work will involve:

- Digging out to make the road wider and to add a cycleway and parking bays
- Installing new stormwater drainage channels
- Building up the new cycleway
- Installing a thick concrete subbase for the new road
- Installing a new kerb and channel
- Installing six new driveways
- Paving the final asphalt surfacing for the new road



Traffic management and detours

- Residents will still be able to access their properties throughout the road closure.
- Emergency services vehicles will be able to access the road in an emergency.
- For everyone else, please follow the detour routes as shown in the diagrams below. We'll also post traffic signs along the surrounding roads that give directions.
- Please take care when driving through the area. Follow all detour signs, signals, and directions by our traffic management teams. Plan ahead and allow extra time to reach your destination.
- The traffic management crew onsite will be available to assist drivers and other travellers throughout the road closure.
- We'll do our best to start the work on time and complete it as quickly as possible. Factors such as wet weather could mean delays. If the delay is significant, we'll notify the community immediately.

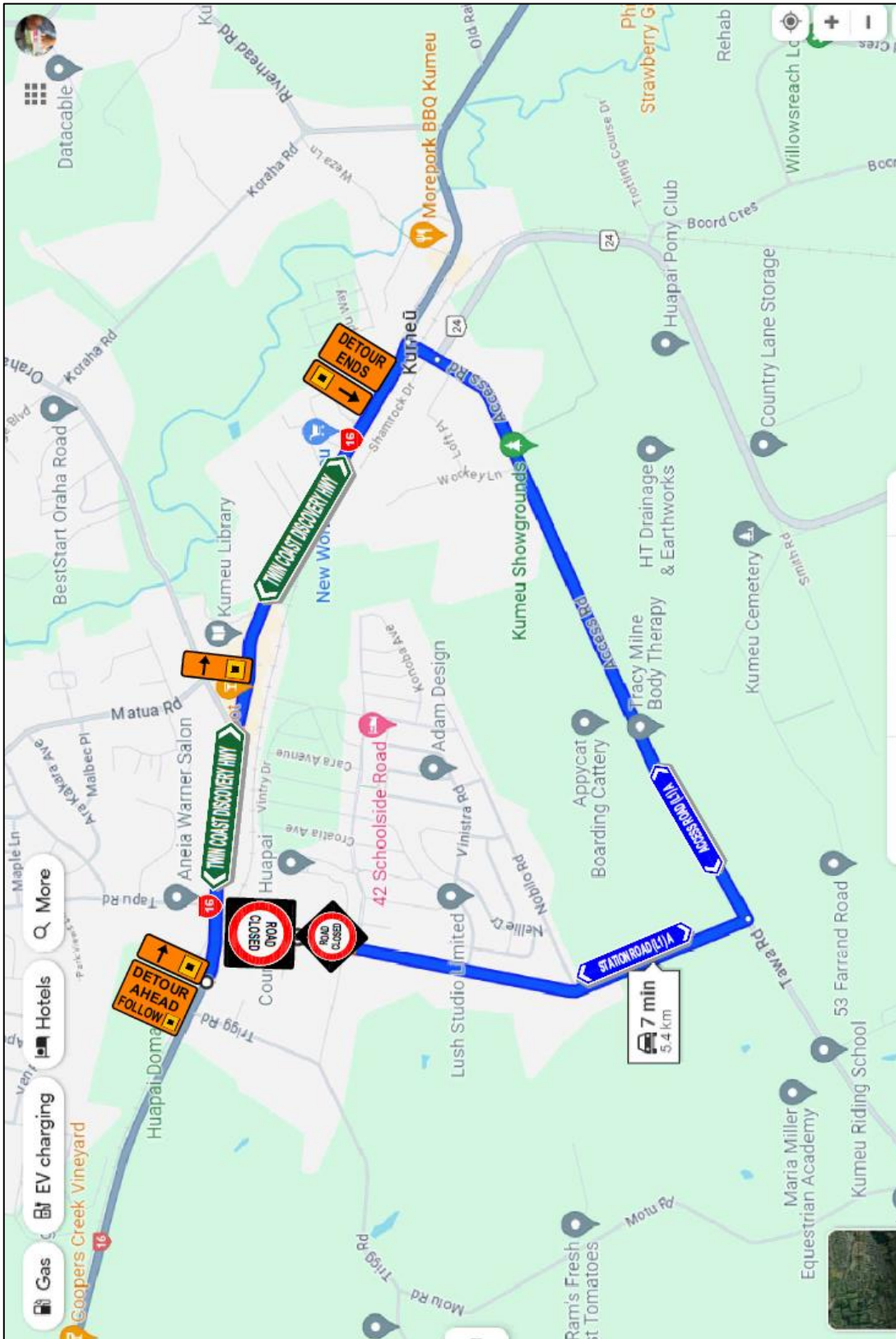
The extended closure will help us ensure a safer and more efficient work environment, ultimately leading to a better outcome for the entire community.
