Big improvements to public transport are made possible by level crossing removals



Opening City Rail Link next year will mean trains on the Southern Line every five to eight minutes during peak times making it easier to connect with people and places.

Replacing level crossings with bridges is key to our plan for the years after City Rail Link opens to further increase public transport use by providing even more frequent train services.

Replacing level crossings with bridges in Takanini is a key part of making this happen and will allow even more trains to run while improving safety and keeping traffic moving.

Auckland Transport (AT), KiwiRail, and NZTA are working together on this vital investment to help give Aucklanders transport options that make their journeys quicker, easier and safer.

We're getting ready to remove and replace level crossings in Takanini

Seven new bridges are planned to be built to replace level crossings in the Takanini area.

New pedestrian bridges will start being built this year at Takanini and Te Mahia Stations, providing a safer way to access the stations.

Three new road bridges are planned to be built in Takanini, along with two walking and cycling bridges. This allows level crossings on roads to then be closed. Planning work has been taking place since 2022, and we're now moving into the delivery phase, this includes updating and finalising designs by looking at how everything connects to make your journeys safer, easier, and more enjoyable.
