

In our August summary, we want to update you on what's been happening on Line Road and finishing touches at the Apirana/Pilkington/ Tripoli roundabout, and future works.

In short



We've **completed the cycleway and pedestrian upgrades along Line Road**, from Taniwha Street to West Tamaki Road. Road maintenance works are now underway on Line Road.



We've **completed the Apirana, Pilkington and Tripoli roundabout upgrades,** making it safer for pedestrians and cyclists travelling through here.



We plan to start construction of the Merton East Cycleway and carry out road maintenance from 15 September 2025. These works will take about 12 weeks in total.



We've completed the Line Road Cycleway!

To support safer, more sustainable travel for Glen Innes residents and Aucklanders, we have built a cycleway from Taniwha Street to West Tamaki Road.

We have also installed raised crossings at key intersections, painted pedestrian and bike crossings between the Eastview Reserve and the Taniwha Reserve, repainted bus stops at 8, 36, and 78 Line Road, added a wide, low-profile speed bump outside 77 Line Road.

We would like to thank everyone for your patience and your continued support for this project.

Please help keep our people and the cycleway safe by not parking on the new cycleway.

We've installed a new crossing on West Tamaki Road!


To keep our people and community safe, we installed a raised pedestrian crossing near the shops. We also installed new kerb & channels, traffic islands, street lighting, and pavement repairs required for the cycleway.





Roundabout works are complete!

The Apirana, Pilkington, and Tripoli roundabout upgrades are now complete. We have added an off-road cycleway, installed raised pedestrian and cyclist crossings on all legs of the roundabout, installed new drainage, and replaced a traffic island.





Works currently underway: Line Road renewal works

We're making steady progress on the renewal works along Line Road. Stage 1 works, from West Tamaki Road to Weybridge Crescent, is now complete.

Here's what to expect over the coming weeks:

Stage 2: Works will continue from Weybridge Crescent to Farringdon Street, starting Sunday, 8 September, with completion expected by Sunday, 22 September.


Stage 3: The final section, from Farringdon Street onwards, is scheduled to begin on Monday, 23 September, and wrap up by the end of October.

Stage 4: The final stage of this work will be asphalt resurfacing. We will update you coser to the time with a start date.

Please note, wet weather or unforeseen circumstances may delay the start or finish of the works. If there are any big delays, we will tell you. We appreciate your patience as we carry out these works




Getting Line Road ready for asphalt resurfacing!





What's next: Greening and road markings

In some areas, line marking and greening of the cyleways still need to be completed. This work is weather dependant and will be completed in the warmer months





What's next: Merton Road East Cycleway construction

Where will you be working? Along Merton Road, between the Morrin Road and Apirana Avenue roundabouts.

What are you constructing? An off road cycleway along the northern side of Merton Road. We will also install zebra crossings for cyclists and pedestrians at the Merton, Morrin, and Felton Matthew Road roundabout.

Why are we doing these works? The Merton Road cycleway will connect people to the heart of Glen Innes. Locals will have more opportunities to visit shops and sporting destinations or catch the train.

How long will it take? The works will take about 12 weeks to complete in total.

When are the works happening? From 15 September we'll be working overnight (7:30 pm - 6 am) throughout the week, except between 6am Saturday and 7:30pm Sunday the following day.
