The final push to complete road repairs and resurfacing on Great North Road

Kia ora,

Night works – road repairs

Road repairs are progressing well on the southern side of Great North Road with concrete curing in most areas. We are about to begin the next stage which involves a 'deep lift' in some areas (see map below). This means a thicker layer is removed from the surface of the road. The deep lift areas extend across the centre of the road, so it is not possible to maintain two-way traffic flow. For this reason, the work will be completed at night.

When	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 6 night shifts Monday 24 November – 2 December 2025 Monday – Thursday nights only 6:00pm – 5:00am It may take longer to complete work if the underground surface is of bad quality. We are doing preliminary investigations to determine the state of the underground surface.
Where	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Starting on the southern side of Great North Rd near Crummer Road and working towards Ponsonby Rd. Then switching to the northern side and working from Crummer Rd to Ponsonby Rd (see map below)

Great North Road resurfacing – night works

Road resurfacing will start after road repairs are complete (see map below). We will lay new asphalt and line mark the road. This work will be done at night, allowing for more extensive road closures so we can complete the work more efficiently and ensure a high-quality finish. We will work on one side of the road at a time, starting near Crummer Rd and working towards Ponsonby Rd.

When	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Southern side – 3 nights starting approximately 3 December Northern side – 3 nights starting approximately 9 December, after southern side complete 6:00pm – 5:00am Monday – Thursday only

After asphaltting and linemarking is complete, we will install the cycle lane separators. This will be done during night shifts at the beginning of December but may continue 15 – 18 December.

Side road resurfacing – night works

On some side streets, up to five meters of temporary asphalt next to the new intersections needs to be replaced with permanent asphalt. This work is currently scheduled to start on 25 November, however it may be deferred to Auckland Transport's general road maintenance programme in the new year. You would be notified about revised dates.

What we are doing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Digging out the temporary asphalt, preparing the road surface and laying new asphalt.

Night works – how they may impact you

- Sections of Great North Road will be closed to all traffic except buses. There will be detours in place. Detours will be posted online www.AT.govt.nz/greatnorthroad
- Works will create noise. We will work hard to complete the noisiest work before 10:30pm. There will be machinery and vehicle movement noise at other times.
- Line marking is not particularly noisy work.
- The night crew are aware of nearby residents and will limit unnecessary noise.
- No on-street parking will be available near our worksites. You may need to park on your property or on a side road and walk to your property.

All work is weather dependent and may be postponed in the event of bad weather. This may delay start dates of subsequent stages.
