Traffic Management Update:

We are happy to announce that all traffic management deployed as part of the Pt Chevalier to Westmere project will be removed during the week commencing **Monday 16 December, with everything removed by Friday 20 December.** This will allow the community and businesses to experience a great holiday break and be able to enjoy moving around the community unincumbered by traffic cones and closures.

What does this mean?

- 1. All traffic management plans lifted related to Point Chevalier to Westmere improvements project
- 2. Pt Chevalier Road open to two-way traffic this includes all side roads and Gt North Road intersection
- 3. Meola Road and side roads fully open
- 4. Garnet Road and side roads fully open

Please be patient with our team that are working over this time as there will be a lot of changes, it may take people time to adjust to the new road layout.

January - What's Up

Work will recommence on **Monday 6 January** to complete finishing works, such as planting, line marking, signage, street furniture and any remedial work required. While this work will be less intrusive, there may be locations and periods where traffic management, including lane closures and Stop/Go may be required to complete this work.

Key Achievements: 2024

Innovative Approaches:

- Concurrent Work on Roundabouts: Both Garnet Road/Meola Road and Point
- Chevalier Road/Meola Road roundabouts built at the same time, significantly accelerating the timeline.
- Concurrent Work on Roundabouts: Both Garnet
- Road/Meola Road and Point Chevalier Road/Meola Road roundabouts built simultaneously, significantly reducing the project timeline.

Congestion During Construction

We appreciate that traffic congestion is a result quite often of road works being carried out in the area along with other factors (private developers, emergency works, school traffic etc).

We work with our contractor and traffic management team to manage this and make changes to the traffic management as much as possible, our contractor also regularly undertakes reviews of the current traffic management in place and makes changes where needed.

Congestion notably occurs when traffic demand exceeds road capacity, when an incident such as a crash or a vehicle breakdown occurs or when roadworks take place, all temporarily reducing capacity and disrupting the traffic flow. The circumstances causing congestion may be permanent (for example at a lane drop on a motorway section or two motorways merging) or incidental (such as following a crash or broken-down vehicle).

While we recognise that roadworks can cause inconvenience, it is crucial that we all remain respectful to the teams who are doing their best to keep traffic moving safely. Abuse of any kind whether verbal or physical will not be tolerated at any time.

Our workers are doing their job with care, and your patience and respect make a positive difference.

Dempsey Wood Sustainability Achievements

We are pleased to share a significant achievement in sustainability: the introduction of low carbon concrete. By replacing traditional Portland cement with low carbon blends, we were able to reduce overall carbon emissions by approximately 10 to 15%.

Additionally, further carbon reductions were achieved by recycling aggregates from the excavated road, using them as a substitute material in the project.

FAQs

Are you finishing all the work earlier or just lifting the Traffic management and then putting it back again?

We are lifting the current traffic management earlier than expected as we are ahead of the current staging diagram delivery plan. This is because we have made significant gains in progress due to using innovative delivery methodology and full use of the extended closure on Meola Road early in the year.

While there will be no traffic management devices from 16 December related to PtC2W, we will still need to complete finishing works and any remedial work from January 2025. There will be a requirement to implement traffic management during this work.

What do you mean by remedial work?

With all civil construction works an audit is undertaken at the completion to ensure work meets the required standards. There is likely to be some work that needs to be redone done, either minor adjustments or a re-work of some locations. This is completely normal in the process of delivering any civil construction project.

Does the early lift of the traffic management in our community mean the project is completely finished?

No, there is still work to be completed from early January 2025. This work includes street furniture, signage, line marking and remedial work.

What have we done in November?

Huge progress has been made during November and early December.

Meola Road:

- Work between Kiwi Road and the roundabout completed, and the road opened
- Round about work completed ahead of schedule

Pt Chevalier Road:

- Paving works completed along Point Chevalier Road, Meola Road roundabout to Great North Road intersection.
- Cycle lanes and footpaths completed
- Roundabout work completed and opened ahead of schedule

Garnet Road:

- Roundabout work completed ahead of schedule
- New manhole installed
