From the BMX pump track to the skatepark, there are plenty of opportunities to develop new skills. Whether you're heading to the playground, enjoying weekend sports, or taking a break by the duck pond, there's something for every rider to enjoy.



Explore the Hauraki

Half Moon Bay by bike and ferry

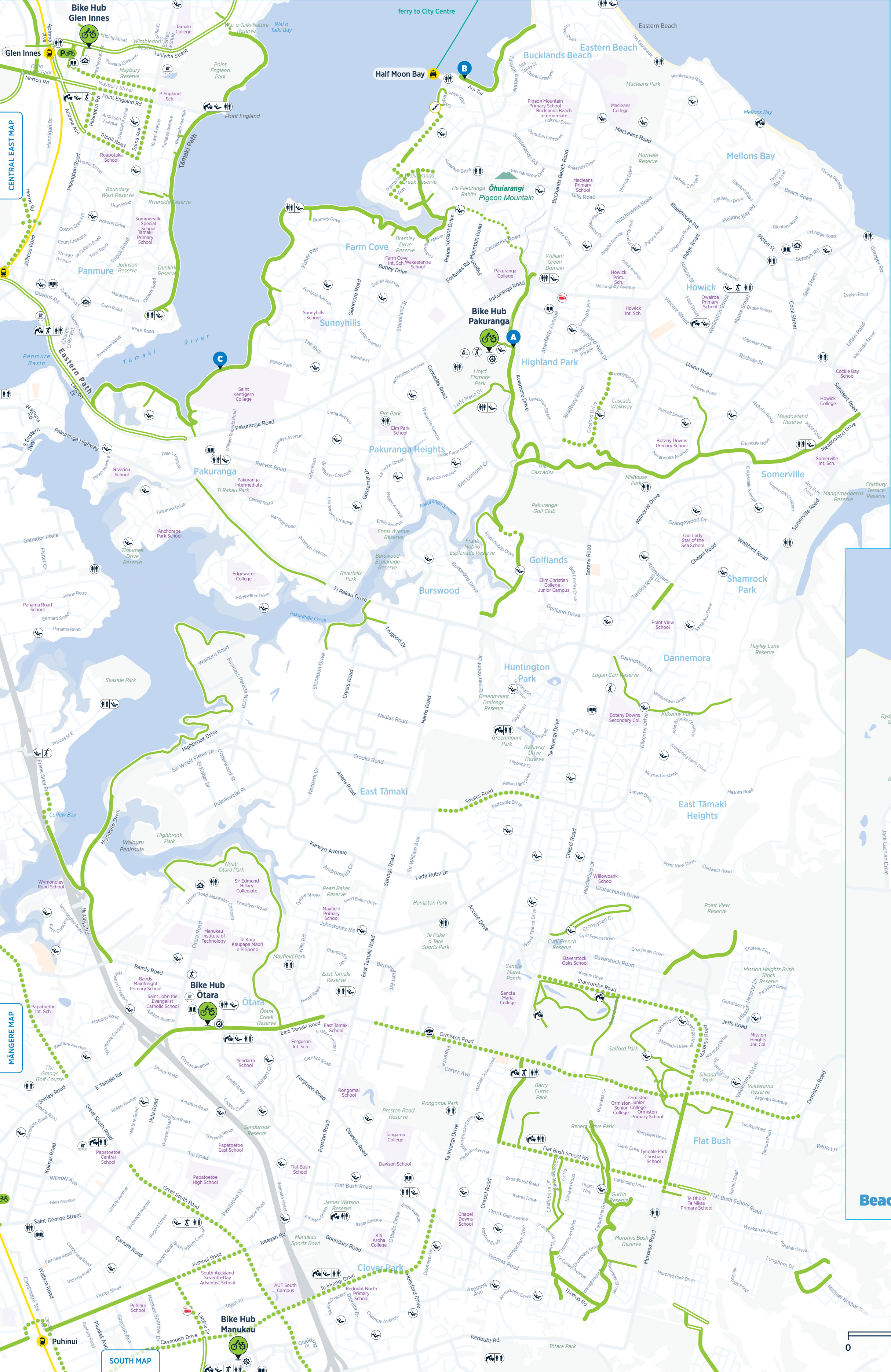
Cycle the scenic routes around Half Moon Bay, taking in views of the Tāmaki River and Rangitoto. Afterward, hop on the ferry for a relaxing cruise across the harbour. Whether you're heading to Waiheke Island or exploring the city waterfront, this is a great way to venture from bike to boat and beyond.

Cycle the Rotary Path for waterfront views

Cycle along the Rotary Path for a smooth, flat ride with views of the Tāmaki River and Maungarei (Mt Wellington). This popular 9km route connects Farm Cove to the Panmure Bridge, passing picnic spots, a playground, and the local sailing club. Keep an eye out for local birdlife, and enjoy the peaceful vibe as you ride. It's a perfect blend of nature and relaxation, ideal for cyclists of all levels.



Types of paths



Ara paihikara
Cycle path



People cycling are separated from motor vehicles by physical barriers such as planters, kerbs or bollards.



Ara ngātahi
Shared path



People cycling share wide paths with people walking, running and other active movement. Paths are raised or away from motor vehicles.



Hononga ā-huarahi
On-road connection



People cycling share the road with motor vehicles, which may include a dedicated painted lane.
