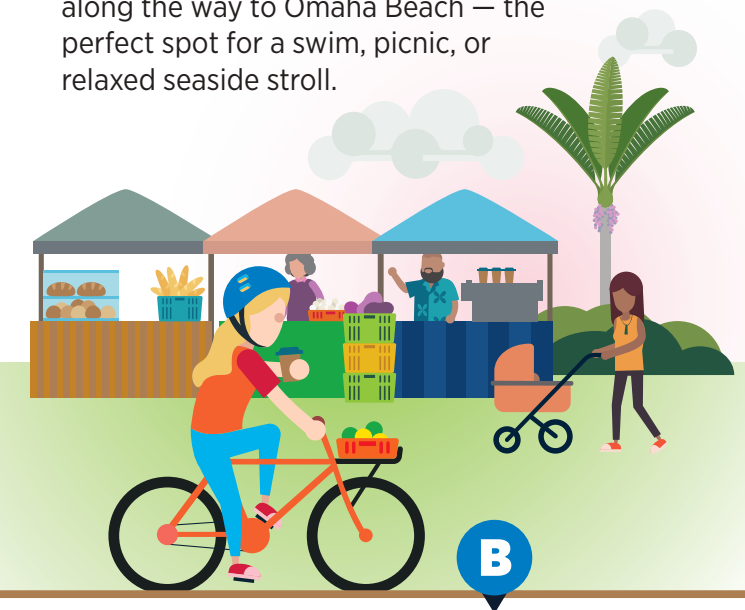




Matakana to Omaha

Market by bike

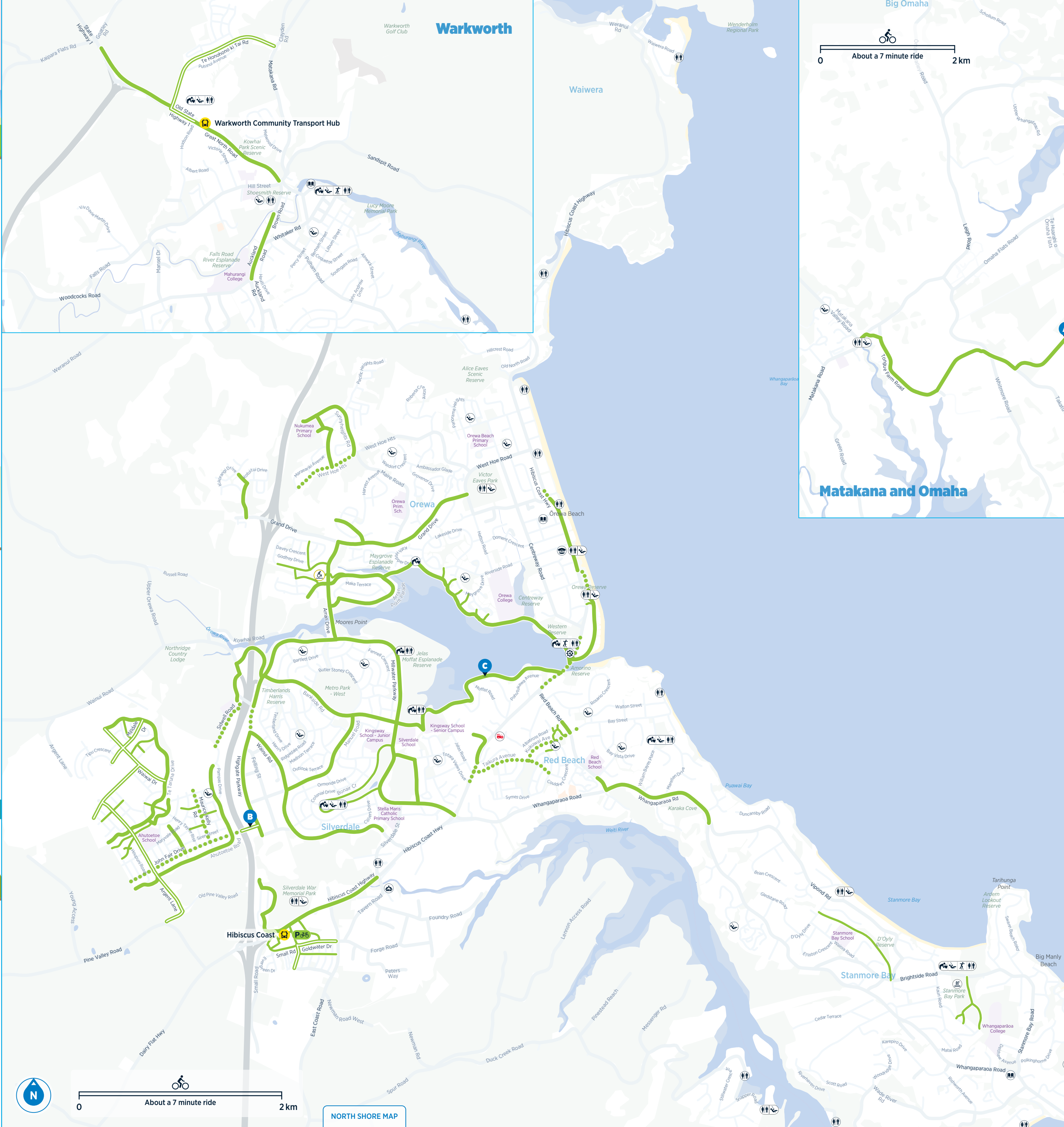

A scenic estuary loop to the shore

Explore Te Ara Tahuna

Ride the Te Ara Tahuna Path, a gentle loop around the Ōrewa Estuary, before rolling straight to the sands of Ōrewa Beach. Spot wildlife, take in Māori carvings, and enjoy the estuary's tranquil beauty along the way. With cafés, picnic spots, and even a skate park en route, this ride is perfect for all ages and abilities.



Types of paths



Ara paihikara
Cycle path



People cycling are separated from motor vehicles by physical barriers such as planters, kerbs or bollards.



Ara ngātahi
Shared path



People cycling share wide paths with people walking, running and other active movement. Paths are raised or away from motor vehicles.



Hononga ā-huarahi
On-road connection



People cycling share the road with motor vehicles, which may include a dedicated painted lane.
