Some you may be already using, others are less obvious to find. Some of these cut-throughs provide improved access for those with mobility aids or prams.

‘Cut-throughs’ are access through a building and are not often obvious from the street. Commercial buildings are generally open Monday-Friday 8am-5pm. However, hours can vary. Train stations open with the first train and close after the last train.
