Subject: **TTM Update #76: AT Road Controlling Authority Notice - Transition to New Zealand Guide to Temporary Traffic Management (NZGTTM)**

This notice is given as the Road Controlling Authority (RCA) for the Auckland Transport (AT) road network and under AT's authority to manage access to this road network.

In April 2023, the New Zealand Transport Agency published the New Zealand Guide to Temporary Traffic Management (NZGTTM). This new guide outlines how to use a risk-based approach to plan and mitigate the risks to road workers and road users to keep them safe. The guide provides advice to organisations on how to put risk assessment and planning first before decisions on control types and equipment are made. The transition to a risk-based approach aims to ensure that Temporary Traffic Management (TTM) setups are as safe as possible for the specific risks at each site.

Auckland Transport has started implementing a risk-based approach to TTM, following the advice outlined in the New Zealand Guide to Temporary Traffic Management (NZGTTM). The guide's risk-based approach will require a new way of thinking and working to keep everyone safe on our roads. AT recognises it is going to take time to embed this new way of working, and as the Auckland RCA, is committed to supporting the industry through this change.

To aid the industry and ensure alignment across all participants in the system, AT is working towards a complete transition to a risk-based approach by 1 July 2026.

What does this mean for you?

From 1 July 2026, AT will only be assessing Corridor Access Requests under the NZGTTM. This will require applicants to include a risk assessment with their application. Corridor Access Request applications without a risk assessment after this date may be declined.

Applicants are encouraged to view the next 12 months as a transition, with AT open to receiving NZGTTM based applications now.

What will be happening over the next 12 months?

Over the next 12 months AT will be running a series of webinars to update you on this transition and provide opportunities for you to ask questions. To help us develop information and material to support you during the transition, please advise us of any questions you may have. We will collate these questions and provide answers in the coming months.
